President's Report


Our 22nd annual Vintage Cup Down-Under planned to be held at the Melbourne Gun Club for the 20th of November, had to cancelled due to the recent flooding that our State had experienced. Not only were the extensive grounds under water, but the club house was flooded up to 1 metres. With this in mind, we were able to reschedule the shoot to the Frankston Australia Gun Club for a week earlier (Sunday the 13th November). Our sincere appreciation to the Frankston Club committee of management for assisting us and to permit our club to conduct a shoot at short notice. The weather forecast for the area had predicted heavy rain, storms, local flooding on the day of the shoot, however this did not occur, and although it was damp underfoot, it turned out to be a mild clear day, and attracted 46 nominations for the 50 target event. The results are on page 12. Since our shoot at Frankston, the situation has improved at the Melbourne Gun Club, and sealed road assess is now possible. Several working bees have been conducted, two mining pumps employed to drain the above grounds and underground trap layouts. Power has been restored, toilets operating, several traps in operation, and a couple of limited shoots conducted. It is envisaged that the club will be fully operational by the new year. Contrary to what some of our members believe, the club

Licencing and Regulations Division (LRD)

Firearms Amnesty: Victoria has seen around 1600 firearms handed in. Crime Stoppers has also launched its second phase, National Illicit Firearms Campaign, encouraging people to report illegal firearm.

Legislative change: Legislative Change under the Firearms and Other Amendments Act 2021 take effect today, 30 August 2022. Changes include:

- Dealer must sight a valid licence for persons aged 14 and over;
- Loan & hire is limited to one month and can only be extended once; and
- Storage requirements to category A and AB.

LRDs media campaign has resulted in an excellent uptake of people upgrading their storage.

Firearm Licensing: Processing times for new applications are 60-65 days. Processing times for renewal applications are 30 days.

Permits, Transactions and Approvals: Permit to Acquire processing timeframe is currently at 7 days.

Compliance and Enforcement: The primary focus has been on expired and deceased estate firearm holders. The way that Vic Pol collects data in this area has changed, with data being received from births, deaths and marriages more frequently to assist in informing a firearms dashboard with Vic Police. This allows members to easily identify if firearms are attached to expired licence or deceased person and deal with them promptly.

Service Victoria: From 31st August 2022, category A and AB firearms licence applicants will obtain their registration of interest to hunt pest animals on Crown land certificate by applying online via Service Victoria or alternative applicants can still call Department of Environment, Land, Water and Planning (DELWP) on 136 186 Monday to Friday during business hours.

Our Dress Code for ladies and gentlemen is **smart casual** only.


We have had this code in place since our first shoot which was in 2000.

California quail and Chukar partridge hunt.

On grand final day, 4 fellow guns and I, enjoyed a walked-up hunt for partridge and California quail at "Forest Creek Game Birds", near Heathcote in central Victoria. Rick and Christine Price have been running this shoot for about 7 years and have developed it into a fantastic day out not just for the shooting, but for the relaxed no rush experience, where they put the guns first and try hard to give them a special day.

Some teams book a mixture of c/quail and partridge and others just one species. Whatever you want.

As long as you are a reasonable shot, the return of birds to the bag, can when scenting conditions are just right, be over 90 % of the number of birds put out, especially when shooting over Rick's excellent GSPs and Springer Spaniels. Rick is happy for the guests to bring their own dogs, however if Fido doesn't perform as well as you thought, Rick will use his dogs if everyone is happy.

In our case, we had three of our own dogs, a lab, a Visla and a Brittany spaniel. A couple of these dogs were young with some field experience and by the end of the day were doing very well. In saying that, it is not the place to bring a dog with little experience for a training session, as this will cost you and your fellow guns birds.

We booked 36 birds of both varieties with a return of 27. We were very happy with the result considering we weren't paying close enough attention a couple of times being caught wrong footed.





Depending on weather conditions on the day, you could be shooting along a creek that bisects the property or open pasture and on occasions a neighbour's tussocky paddocks.

There was 5 guns in our group, which in my opinion is plenty. More than that can be a little crowded particularly when hunting the creek.

At the end of the shoot, Chris provided lunch in an old portable school classroom where we enjoyed appetisers, homemade soup, followed by lamb and salad rolls. We naturally enjoyed some

wonderful Heathcote Shiraz to top it all off. By the way, the plan is to convert this old

classroom to accommodation for 6 guests with a kitchen and a sitting area.

This shoot was the sixth occasion we have shot there and is a permanent fixture in our shoot calendar.




